## Member's Memories

During a committee meeting we were discussing articles for the newsletter when it was commented on how interesting it was to read Jackie Lloyd's and Sam Parkinson's piece on Max and April as it gave an insight into how they started in endurance. This led to the idea that committee members could each write a piece about how we became involved and our memories. I was volunteered to be the first victim to write for you, so here goes, I hope you find it interesting - Rachel

As some of you know, I have a passing interest in Fell Ponies, well, let's say they are something of an addiction! I got my first fell mare, Heltondale Emma, at the end of 1990 having lost my first pony, Hannah, to cancer. As I had lost my nerve a bit due to a couple of accidents, it was suggested that I got a fell pony, a friend of my boss knew of one for sale at the Darrenvale Stud so, one Sunday morning my boss and I duly trotted off to Darwen...now, it wasn't love at first sight, but I knew what one should look like and bless her, she had only been ridden for three weeks! Now you could be forgiven for thinking I was mad just taking her on a month's trial there and then but I could tell she was a kind pony.

After I bought her, I had to decide on a stable name, as both my nieces were called Emma, this was ruled out and we called her Ellie. We began riding out and she would go all day, and she really enjoyed being hacked out, she never, ever, got used to pushchairs or umbrellas and a certain type of grid that is used mainly across lanes and tracks! She learned to tolerate dogs-she would kick them if they got too close and quite a few went into orbit!



Whilst hacking out I used to meet another rider regularly who at the time lived at Tockholes and who owned some land near me at Withnell, she was called Joan Austin and she rode an Arab called Bramble and she used to lead a Shetland (Billy) as she went back and forth between her home and field. Joan also had an Exmoor mare called Moorland Pipit, Ellie and Pipit became great friends. I had got to know Joan really well and I had discovered that she did this thing called endurance with the EHPS and BERA-long distance she said it was!

Joan began to ride Ellie after she lost Bramble to colic as Pip wasn't ready and was having her foal Furze. Ellie was quite up for this as Joan liked to trot everywhere! I asked if she would like to ride Ellie on one of these 'endurance' rides and she said "no!

She's your pony, you can! I'll find you one to do..." Eeek!

This was still a very daunting thought for me as my confidence was still not that great-Joan decided it was high time I stopped being a wimp and did a few things with Ellie. Little did she know where that would take us...

One October Joan said Ellie and I were going to a ride at Rivington, "you'll be ok there, after all, it's where you work! I'll find you someone to ride with..." Enter Pauline McCartney on Kingsley and Jeff Wood on Arran, Pauline just told me to keep trotting, you'll be ok! 16 miles later I asked Joan why she didn't tell me what it was like before I had done it, because you wouldn't have come was the reply! Ellie and I got our first rosette and a proper photo and when we had got our breath back, we realized how much we had enjoyed ourselves! Joan and I did a few rides a year and as we had limited time and funds, we picked the rides we liked the most. Ellie and I did some showing from time to time, but she always preferred the endurance.

Joan had done some competitive rides with Bramble, so she decided that we would all give it a go with Ellie and Pip, I wasn't that bothered but did them anyway. Sometimes Joan and Pip would do the competitive ride and Ellie and I would do the Pleasure at the same event. Joan felt that Pip relied on Ellie a little too much at times and occasionally Ellie held Pip up. Ellie would go into energy saving mode in the middle of a ride (no matter the distance!) and would go on autopilot where you couldn't alter her pace until she was good and ready. Once out of this 'cruise control' mode however, she would rattle round and we were never out of time. For a hairy native that lived out 24/7, who always had six weeks off for the lambing period, she always got good results.

Ellie loved Ullswater and Tebay in particular, she knew she was home on Ullswater as she was born at High Butterwick as part of the Heltondale Herd, she could fly round there, I have been known to shut my eyes and hang on going down to the fell gate at Askham! We were sometimes joined by my sister-in-law Annette on our other fell mare Kerbreck Night Music, Ellie and Music were even more competitive than Ellie and Pip. The Ponies all loved it and we did rides at St. Michaels, Nateby, Abbeystead, Dolphinholme, Lancaster, Longridge, Rivington, Horwich, Bolton, Bredbury, Haworth, Harewood, Wharcliffe, Coniston Cold, Ulnes Walton to name a few!



Ellie's competitive career came to an end when she was attacked in the field, an injury that nearly caused her death but from which she recovered although she was left with limited movement in her back legs and a balance problem when travelling. She did a bit more showing with my niece Emma as this was gentler for her and we just did two or three rides per year.

In November 2003 Joan moved to near Huntley, Aberdeenshire, where she does rides with the Grampian group of SERC on Furze. By this time Ellie was in her late teens and had arthritis. She did her very last ride at Coniston Cold with Emma in 2006 at 20, I continued to ride her and we retired her from showing at 23 and from ridden work altogether in 2010. Not before she had out walked our much younger gelding in trot! Uphill as well! Very funny to watch, especially as he then had to be led back down the hill by his Auntie Ellie who promptly decided to go into endurance mode! I am sure she

did it on purpose!

Ellie made the decision to take on the role of herd leader, teaching the younger ones, until sadly in December 2013 at 27 I had to have her put to sleep as a result of a fall in the field.

Ellie was and is totally irreplaceable, even though I have other equally nice ponies!

### 16<sup>th</sup> July 2017 Medlock Valley Ride

Every Tuesday Jean Merchant and I try to get out for a walk and while looking through my maps for somewhere different to go I came across a very old leaflet for the Medlock Valley Way, this route was aimed at horse riders so we decided to start walking a bit of it at a time to see if it was still rideable, the first thing we found was that there were quite a few discrepancies and we had to get out the Ordnance Survey map and the A to Z to find out where we were supposed to be, also fresh bits of track had been added and others were not really good to ride any more for various reasons. Anyway over several months Jean and I walked it and tweaked it till we thought we had a viable ride. Anyone who has done this ride knows that there are hills, hills and then more flippin' hills! We were pretty fit by the time we had it sorted- lol!

We ran it in 2015 and it went very well and everyone seemed to enjoy it but there were a couple of places that I wasn't too happy with so I decided to box out on a regular basis and explore and try to find an alternative to one particular road that was quite fast and also had a farmers market with a large sign flapping about at the side of the

The day before the ride heavy rain was forecast so we decided to mark the bulk of it on the Friday and Sarah Bamber had walked the new loop with us a couple of weeks before and she said she would mark it herself on the Saturday but at the last minute my nerves got the better of me and I said I would go with her to make sure that we had it right, well the weather forecast was right and we were like drowned rats and we were praying that the markers didn't get washed away !

The morning of the ride was dry but a bit cool and overcast but soon started to warm up and all of the riders went out without waterproofs which was nice to see after the foul weather the day before. We had 41 entries and every one turned up! It was lovely not to have any no shows. Everyone seemed to really enjoy the ride and I am pleased to say the markers stayed in place and no-one got lost; in fact we had comments about how well it was marked which made all the hard work worth-while.

Medlock is a very varied ride with bits of everything and lots of hills with views to make them worth the climb! There are also some lovely sandy country park type tracks for some good canterers on the way home...We will keep exploring and you never know next year, we may find another loop ( or 2 ) to add to it.

**23rd September 2017 Barton Ride

The week before the ride proved to be very busy with people trying to get a place on what is proving to be a very popular ride on the calendar. Maxine Braithwaite did a fantastic job of taking paper entries and keeping everyone up to date with what was happening on Face-book while Cath and I coordinated the online entries. I have to say this proved challenging at times but Cath proved to be very patient! This year I decided to alter the route for the longer ride taking in an extra bridleway and stream crossing, but the short route remained the same as last year.

The forecast wasn't too bad...at least no rain or wind, and 61 riders set off from the venue Barton Equestrian Centre helped across the motorway bridges by stewards when needed, to do either a 16 km or 26 km route. The stream crossing just after the duck farm had eroded very badly at one side and we had a large hole, so I got in touch with Lancashire County Council 2 months ago to explain our predicament of sending 60 riders along a route with a hole under the water....the fantastic result was that they renewed that side of the crossing with large stones which were cemented in and cleared away a large overhanging branch off a tree, making it all much safer...a big thank you to Stephen Williams (LCC) for his



support. The farmer at the dairy farm had put 2 large logs across one bridleway to stop motorbikes but had left a gap in the middle. When we saw him the week before and explained a ride was coming through he said he would move them...even though there was lots of room...so nice when people are helpful!

The marking proved to be spot on despite heavy rain two hours after Linda Earnshaw and I had done it, with only a couple of riders getting slightly lost as they missed the two arrows at the Duck farm but after phoning us at the venue they were soon back on track! The last bridleway back to the venue got a bit deep and muddy but when you consider 120+ horses had used it that day it held up reasonably well and was certainly a better option than using a busy road. for riders to open due to Angela and Val who trekked along a BW to help at two narrow gates. Sadly, Judy Ainley had an accident when her horse tripped and fell on her way back to the venue but hopefully Ellie is on the road to recovery and her knees will soon be mended.

This ride report cannot be complete without me thanking all the lovely people who gave up their day to help...a long list of helpers but in particular, Kirstie was a godsend at the secretary's desk and I hope she will volunteer again! Many thanks go to all these helpers on and before the day; without them giving up their time we wouldn't be able to put a ride on at all and also to Barton equestrian for letting us take over their car park and supplying scrummy refreshments on the day.
